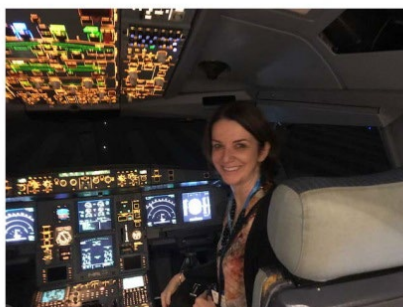


Full Papers
