LPTC Goals and Objectives from 1997 -2000 Strategic Plan

GOAL 1: Increase community awareness (local, regional, and national) of the mission and purpose of LPTC in order to increase enrollment and recognition of the college.

Objective 1: Implement specific promotion plans for visibility and recruitment.

Objective 2: Develop and strengthen relationships with local, state, and federal organizations.

GOAL 2: Strengthen and expand the academic programs at LPTC to meet the changing student and community needs.

Objective 1: Establish and maintain a program that supports faculty awareness and knowledge relating to their discipline.

Objective 2: Implement programs that will assist students in their pursuit of educational goals.

Objective 3: Develop and implement a comprehensive plan for student academic achievement.

Objective 4: Assess the academic and vocational needs of the community in order to provide appropriate programs of study.

GOAL 3: Establish an information technology plan to identify and address needs of students and staff.

Objective 1: Increase computer availability and internet access for all staff and students.

Objective 2: Explore feasibility of distance education.

Objective 3: Increase availability and access to electronic sources in the library.

Objective 4: Create an institution-wide plan for technical maintenance and upgrade.

GOAL 4: Strengthen the institutional research arm of LPTC by establishing a method of collecting and storing institutional data.

Objective 1: Begin the process of institutional research.

Objective 2: Acquire a comprehensive student management software system.

GOAL 5: Continue the process of seeking accreditation from North Central Association.

Objective 1: Complete the self-study process and make application for candidacy and initial accreditation.

Objective 2: Complete a site visit and receive candidacy or initial accreditation.

Objective 3: Implement the recommendations of the site visit team.

GOAL 6: Explore ways to provide facilities to meet students academic, social, and physical needs.

Objective 1: Explore feasibility of locating a new site and building a new facility in conjunction with AICF/AIHEC and Capital Campaign Initiative. Objective 2: Explore feasibility of making current facility more accessible/staff and student friendly.

GOAL 7: Enhance the role of LPTC as a change agent in the Winnebago community by increasing its position as coordinator of training programs and by establishing an educational clearing house for the community.

Objective 1: Network with the Tribal Program directors and community agency leaders to identify and plan appropriate training.

Objective 2: Establish a clearinghouse of educational, career, and job information.

GOAL 8: Assist in the preservation of the Ho-Chunck language and culture.

Objective 1: Create and develop an ongoing database system for language curriculum development.

Objective 2: Develop lesson plans and units to be used in the instruction of Ho-Chunck language.

Objective 3: Offer Ho-Chunck language and culture activities to Winnebago community members, kindergarten through elder.

Objective 4: Develop a Ho-Chunck language resource center to store text, lessons, and recordings of the language.

GOAL 9: Create activities and events that will encourage students to become part of the college community.

Objective 1: Create clubs and activities in the arts.

Objective 2: Provide opportunity for LPTC students to participate in a variety of sporting events.

GOAL 10: Become self-sustaining and achieve financial stability.

Objective 1: Develop a plan for the college to manage its own financial operations.

Objective 2: Create a strategic plan for fund-raising, grant writing, and income-generating projects.
