The *Journal* is interested in scholarly submissions about aviation/aerospace history, educators, curriculum development, innovative methods of instruction, significant research findings that relate to aviation/aerospace education, industry research, and industry and education partnerships. We also wish to reflect the latest industry and academic thought concerning current issues of interest to JAAER readers.

The JAAER is a refereed publication. Manuscripts are blind-reviewed by members of the editorial board as well as a limited number of professionals in that field. This review process takes a minimum of 60 days. From time to time, non-refereed articles may be included in a FORUM section.

## AUTHOR'S GUIDELINES

**Preparation of Manuscripts** The most current edition of the *Publications Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA)* is used as the style guide for submissions. However, authors are instructed to include all tables in the body of the manuscript. Submit five copies of the manuscript; use standard, white, bond paper (copy machine, typing, or computer paper) that will take ink corrections; double space the text; use wide margins (1.5"-2") on all sides; and please number pages. Please do not right (full) justify the manuscript.

**Title** The title of the manuscript should be clearly indicative of its subject and of the author's intention, and should not be unnecessarily long or convoluted.

**Documentation** Manuscripts are to conform to APA reference documentation. References in the text and in the reference list must be compatible. Include in the reference list only those references cited in the text of the article.

**Autobiography** On a separate sheet of paper, include a brief autobiography stating your qualifications for writing this article. If multiple authors, give a brief autobiography for each author.

**Publication Policy** We do not accept material that has been previously published. With your initial manuscript submission we require a statement that "This manuscript has not been previously published in any other publication, and it will not be submitted for publication elsewhere in its present form."
