

Declaration of Ralph W. E. Cox Jr.


I, Ralph W.E. Cox Jr. declare that I have known Marvin J. Griggs for many years, that he was a supervising line Captain for my company U.S. Overseas Airlines Inc., while we were under contract with the U.S. Armed Forces on the Korean Air lift in 1952.

Captain Griggs has an exceptional and impressive record in his long career in both military and civil aviation.

While on an extended leave of absence from this company Marvin Griggs served as air operations officer on the construction of the D. E. W. line in the Canadian Arctic, and afterwards as an air safety inspector for the Civil Aeronautics Board.

Captain Griggs had made arrangements to return to work with U.S. Overseas Airlines as director of operations, when this airline was shut down by a phone call in the middle of the night of September 24, 1964. This act by the Civil Aeronautics Board was without precedent, without notice, without hearing, unconstitutional and brazen in its gestapo-like actions..
