WHY ARE WE HERE? An Editorial

Let us pause and seriously ask this question of ourselves. Did we sell our homes in the States, leave our families and friends and sever all connections with the lives we were used to, only because going to Brasil appealed to us as an opportunity to take a trip? Of course not! Such a superficial reason would not make sense in view of the long range aspect of our program and its meaning to us individually. In the first place we were selected for this work because we had specific and essential qualifications and a prosumed soundness of character, stability and sense of balance that made us worthy of the trust and confidence of our leader, Mr. John Paul Riddle, in our ability to assume responsibility and de a good job.

Before deciding to take this major stop in our lives, we must have individually and in our own way, carefully considered and weighed all the pres and cons particularly having a bearing on what this move would mean to our families and ourselves in the future. There is no doubt that consciously or subconsciously, all of us were to some extent, either directly or indirectly, influenced by an underlying desire to aid in the war offert. After all, we are bern of a free country and even though on the surface, some of us pretend or actually are persuaded by practical metives in things that we do, there is some force within us that is fundamental and inherent in serving to tip the balance scale of decision when our way of life is threatened by war, whether we choose to recognize it or not. This may be called the mob psychology of a free people at war. Let us agree, therefore, that one of the main reasons for our being here is to help Brasil de her part in the world wide struggle for freedem among all peoples and a lasting peace.

Brasil's great President Gotulio Vargus and Air Minister Salgado Filho, have envisioned the future of Brasil in her contribution to the war effort and the subsequent development of her tremendous resources, on a foundation of transportation. They have recognized that one of the most effective means of transportation, adequately able to surmount all surface difficulties, is aviation. There are only about 2500 miles of railreads in the whole of Brasil, built under the greatest of difficulties and at tremendous cost. Although there are 27,000 miles of navigable rivers penetrating to remote and important sections of this vast country and which serve a vital purpose and phase of transportation, their limited pessibilities and effectiveness of scope are obvious. Unquestionably, therefore, aviation in Brasil is one answer to her future. Out of 130,000,000 people in the United States, WE have the unprecedented privilege, hence and opportunity to help Brasil and its far sighted leaders bring about a full realization of this fulfillment of destiny. WE are actually playing in the biggest of big leagues and few of us realize it. How small and insignificant our individual problems seem in this light! Let's seriously reflect on this thought and conduct ourselves with a dignity and pride in our work befitting its scope. THAT'S WHY WE ARE HERE!

INSIDE BRAZIL

Marabá- In the State of Pará, between two rivers lays Marabá, having 10,000 inhabitants. The population consists mostly of Diamond Buyers, Brazil nut merchants and "soringueires" (the word for Rubber workers).

Hud is all over town. The air field is small, but very much used. A wonderful work has been performed by the Brazilian Air Force, keeping the people in contact with the big centers, and helping the natives in many ways.

When the rainy sensen comes in November, Marabé becomes like a Venetian town. Everybody has his own beat to go from place to place.

Harabé is very unhappy with malaria. Every year people contract the disease and oven I had the experience, and up to new my liver resents it.

"Cupunses" is a fruit, originally of Pard, also "Assaby"ç the "Assabyscire" is the palm-tree where you get the fruit; a nice refreshment is made out of it.

We stayed three days in Marabé and then we went to the first stop which was Boa Vista in the State of Goyaz. We travelled night and day, with jungle on both sides. Once in a while you could see a "Jacare" (Brazilian alligator) leafing on some little beach, but at the runer of people coming, they would jump in the water escaping from the sight.

As we advance in our journey, we hear stories about the Indians, especially about the "Gavieds". Very few people can say semething about them. Because if they saw the "Gavieds" they never came back alive.

In this region of Brazil, almost everybody sleeps in harmocks, and I found it very good for health, although my first sleep in the harmock was simply disgraceful, with two times kissing the ground. While traveling, they carry their harmock, strong tobacco, a penknife, or a big knife, starch and dried meat in a little sack.

Bon Vista was at sight. We took a bath in the river right in front of town, and wont to see some friends that had arrived the day before bound for Para. There we had a chance to smoke some cigarettes STUDENT'S KEYHOLE by Floronco Williams and Merio Williams

Recently the Chief of Police has been carrying on a Campaign to put an end to "Luva". Severe fines and jail sentences have been oxacted with the result that luve seekers have begun to see the light. This should result in a material increase in the listings of roputable brokers.
