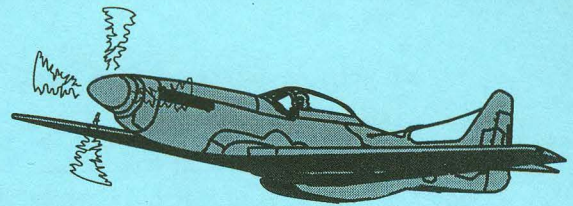

REUNION TIME!



The 1999 Aviation Pioneers Association Reunion will be held at the Sportsman's Lodge in the Empire Room on Saturday, April 24, 1999 from 11:00am to 4:00pm. Please return the enclosed reservation form as soon as possible, but no later than April 2, 1999. Entrance to the Sportsman's Lodge Banquet Rooms is off Coldwater Canyon Boulevard, just north of Ventura Boulevard.

For out-of-towners the Sportsman's Lodge Hotel has made available a block of rooms for one to three nights commencing April 22, 1999. Rates are \$92 per night for a standard room or \$180 per night for a suite, single or double. Reservations number for the hotel is 800 821-8511. As usual there will be a Hospitality Night in the Bar/Lobby area of the Sportsman's Lodge Hotel on Friday, April 23, 1999, the evening before the reunion, from 6:00pm until 7:30pm. There will be a no host bar with complimentary hors d'ouerves. Use the enclosed reservation form if you plan to attend the Hospitality Night.

Guest speaker will be Clay Lacy who will be talking about some of his adventures over the last 50 years he has spent in aviation. He will be showing us some videos as well. Clay started flying DC-3 aircraft for United in 1952. From 1964 to 1972, Clay flew a purple P-51 Mustang in every Unlimited Air Race held. He placed first in the 1970 Reno Unlimited Pylon Race to become the 1970 National Champion. In 1971 he placed first in the last propeller unlimited cross-country race held. He followed that by winning first place in the Fighter Pilot Tournament held in St. Louis, and also placed first in the Jet Class of "The Great Race" from London, England, to Victoria, British Columbia the same year flying a Learjet 24.

With his exclusive Astrovision equipped Learjets, Clay does almost every airline commercial filmed, most Hollywood aerial filming, and much of the photo work for the aircraft industry and military. As a member of the Screen Actors Guild and Directors Guild of America, Clay has participated in dozens of movies. He faked a gear-up landing of a Learjet for the movie, "Capricorn One", and landed a DC-3 (for real!) gear-up, for the movie "The Island". On January 28, 1988, Clay flew a Boeing 747SP around the world, establishing a New Around the World Record and in so doing, raised over \$500,000 for children's charities.
