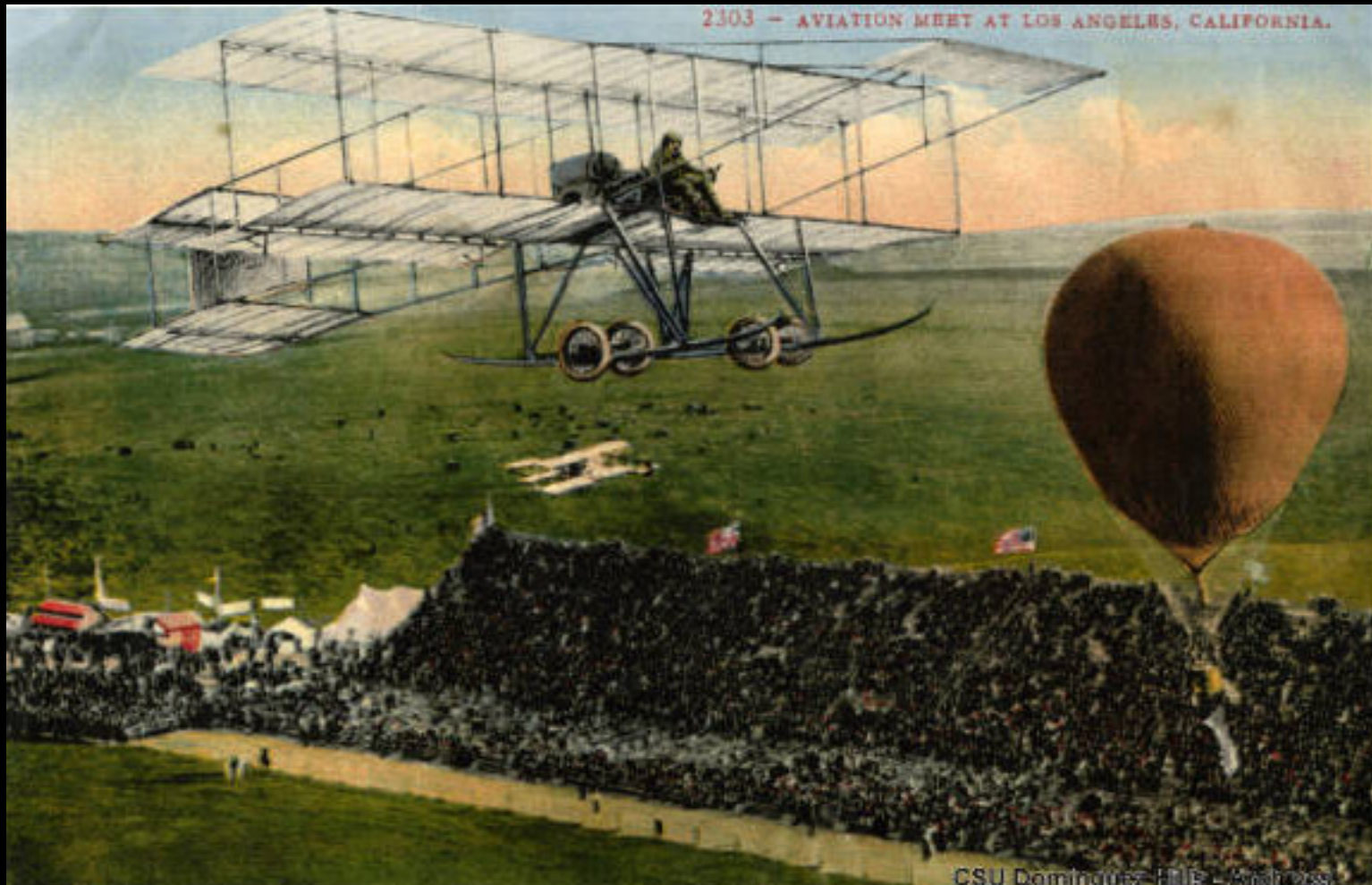

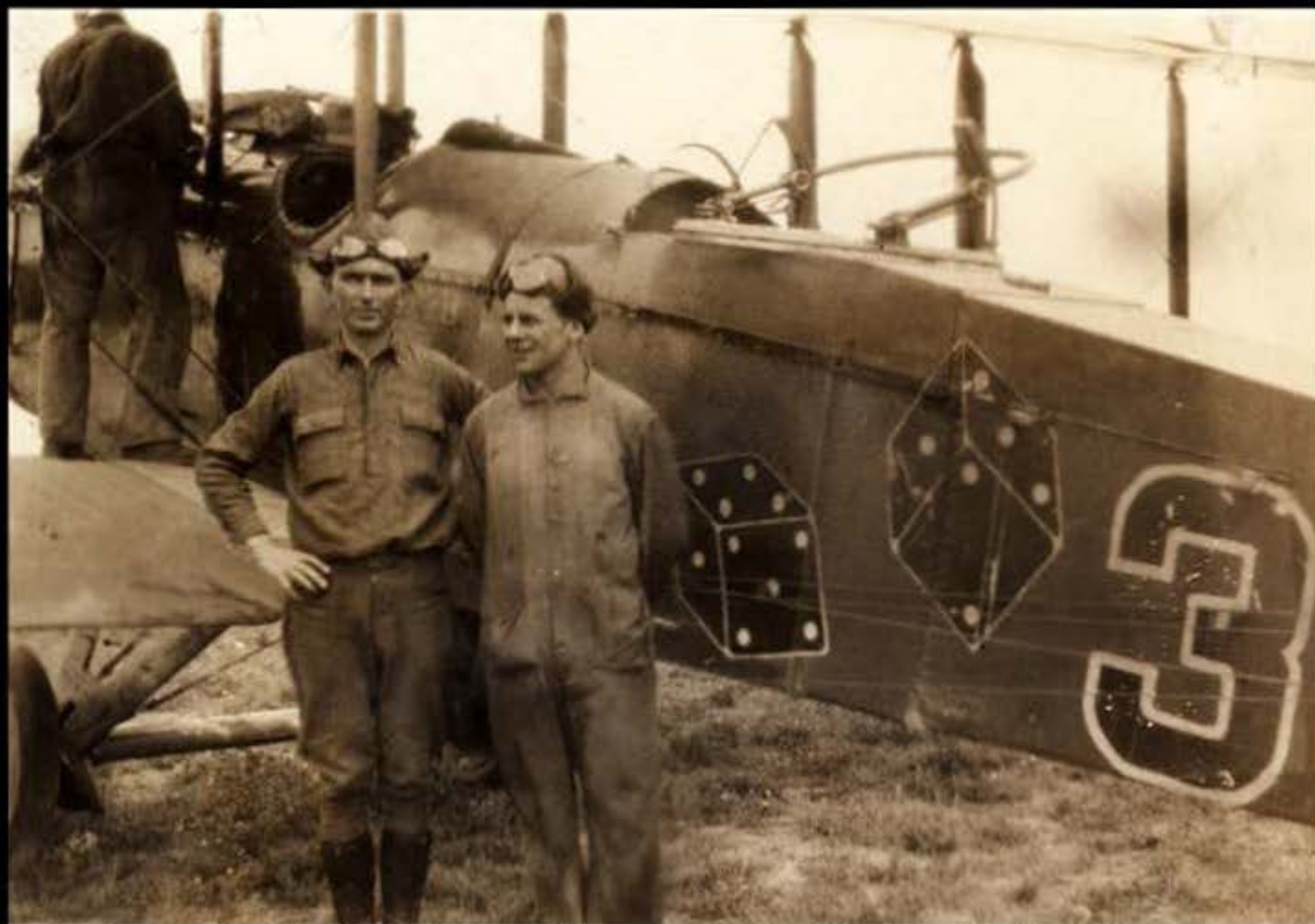

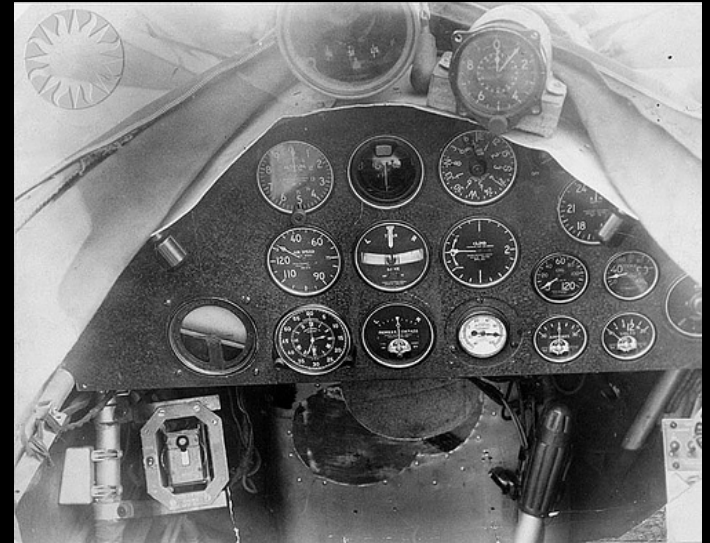

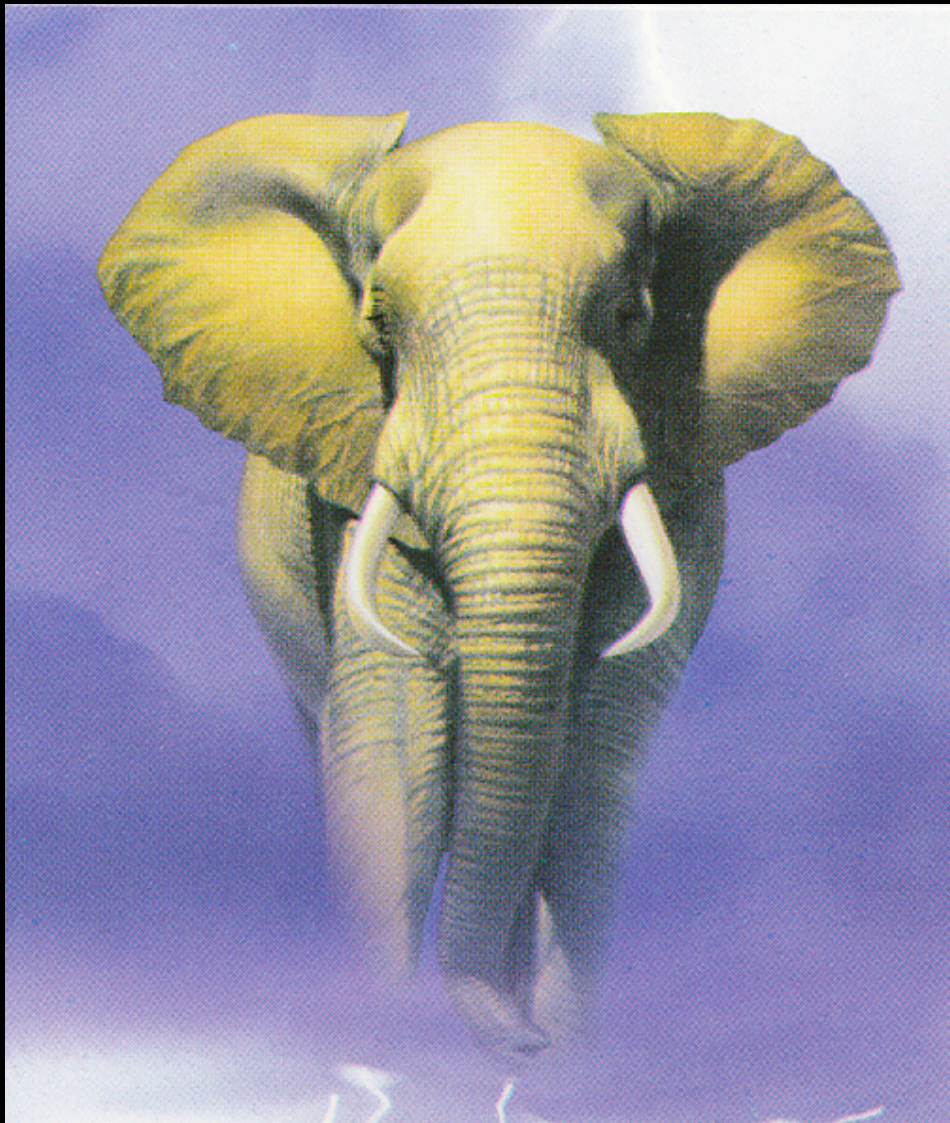

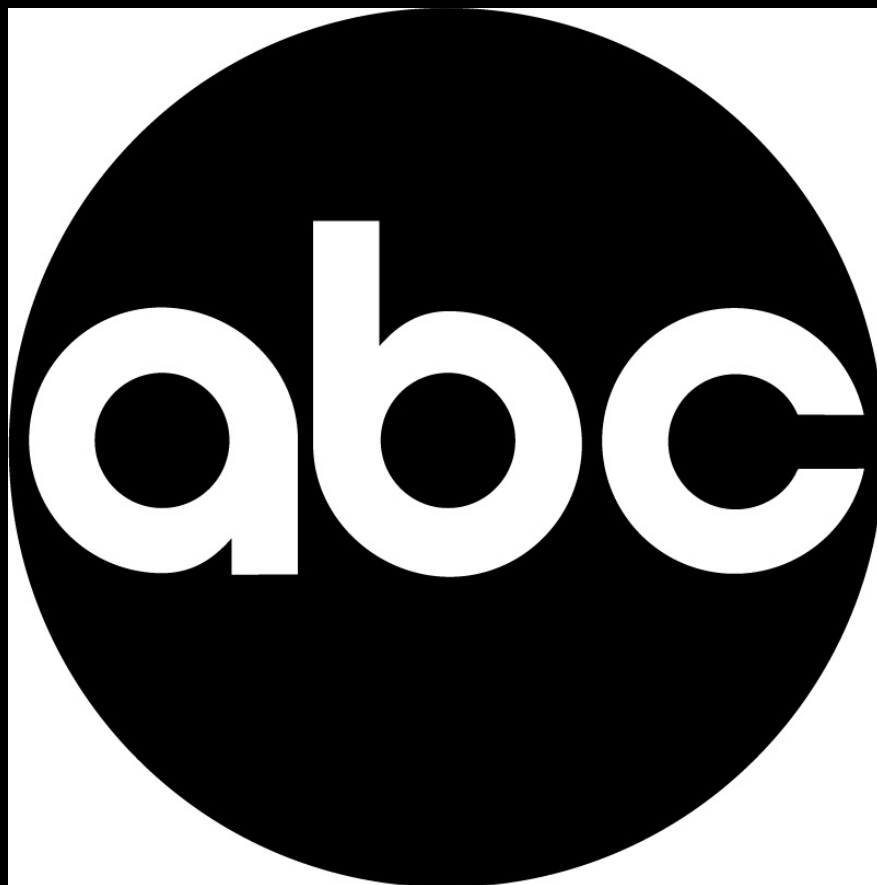
Curtis Wright P-36 Hawk. General Doolittle's round the world demo flight 1933.

and the blind cockpit designed by the General**



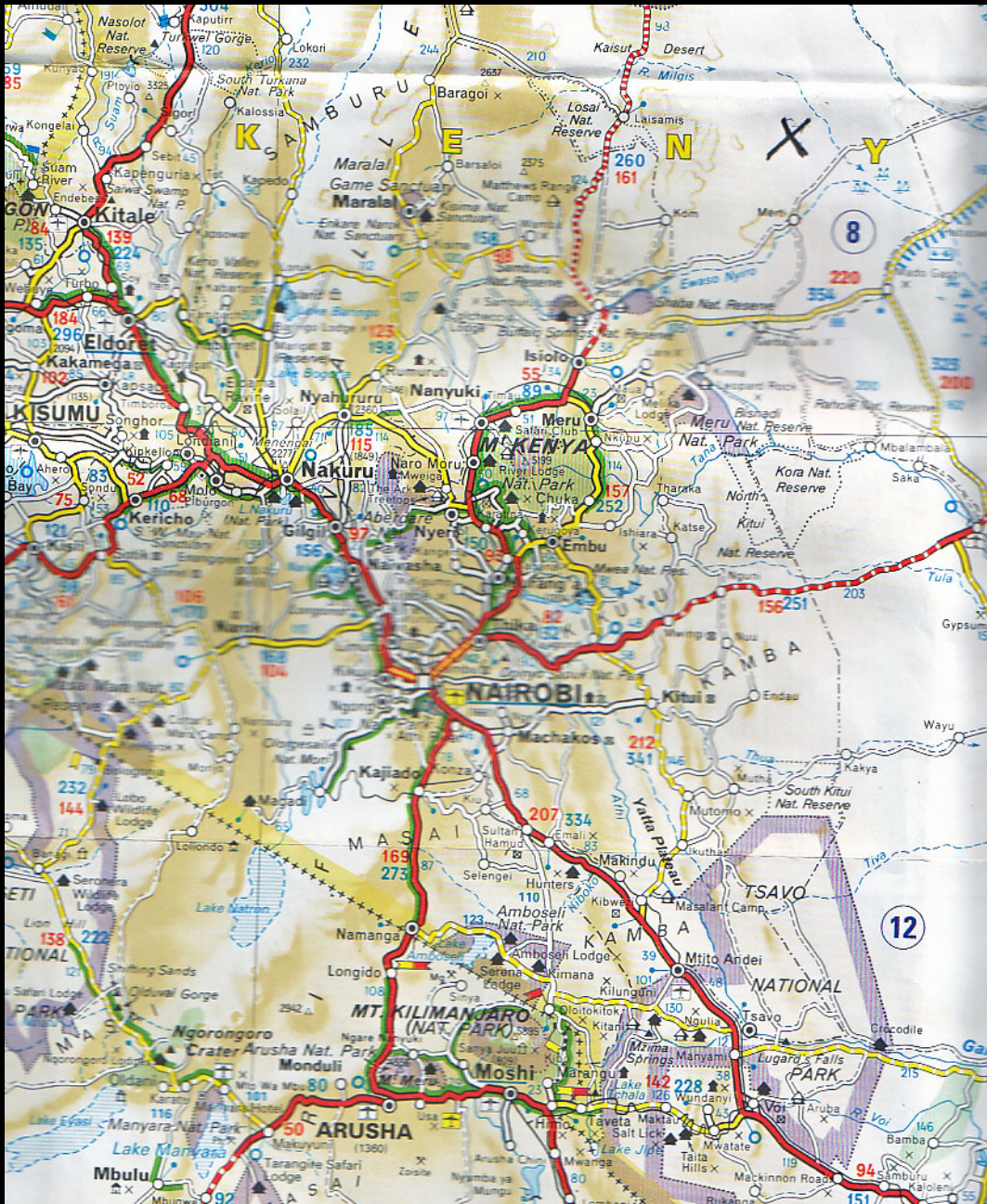

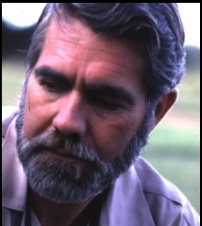
How to trick a wild elephant for classic photo op
