## Avion office firebombed! The University breathes a collective sigh of relief

In what may have been a retaliatory act against poor journalism, the Avion Newspaper office was firebombed last night. Although no one has claimed responsibility for the act, the entire student body is suspect.

The incident occurred after an unheeded streak of particularly bad news coverage on the part of the Avion, a newspaper generally known for its inferior reporting ability.

The firebombing took place at an estimated time of 11:00 p.m., as the ineffectual staff members struggled to meet a deadline that had already been hopelessly missed.

taken place earlier that evening.

The Embry-Riddle Safety department had previously received a number of bombing threats, but had not passed them on to the Avion staff hoping that someone would actually carry through with their promise. The Safety

Department was well rewarded when they heard the fire alarms signifying the destruction of the Avion office.

Fire crews were called at least two hours after the first alarm to guarantee the demise of the Avion once and for all.

The Daytona Beach Police Department has reluctantly agreed to investigate the

"crime", in lieu of more important incidents. Some of these pressing matters include the apprehension of possible leash law violators and a Spring Breaker suspected of fornication with a mollusk.

The motive behind the bombing of the Avion office may be linked to numerous disputes between the Avion and various clubs and organizations within the University.

First and foremost among the Avion's crimes against humanity was the total lack of published SGA election results from the last election. This inexcusable faux pas alone is justification enough for the summary execution of the Avion staff, say local criminologists.

molded into figures which held an alarming similarity to various Avion staff members.

Despite differences of opinion between the Student Government and the Avion, the SGA expressed their sorrow: "We are tremendously saddened by this occasion," giggled SGA President Mary Heitger, "dam it, we really liked those guys."

The Associated Collegiate Press released a statement

concerning the event: "The Avion was a travesty. Their mockery of the journalistic credo was intolerable. We are happy to hear that this sham of a newspaper has been terminated. Without them, the collegiate press can once again be taken seriously. It is regrettable it took so long to squeeze this blackhead from the nose of the First Amendment."

That's about it.

## IALL strike continues against broke Eastern

One year later, the Eastern Machinists strike still drags on. Their signs may be bleached by the sun, and their beards may be turning gray, but Eastern's mechanics and luggage lifters are still on strike.

It was just thirteen months ago when International Association of Luggage Lifters went out on strike against Eastern Airlines. After filing for bankruptcy and returning to the air, however, the IALL strike is still taking its toll.

Unable to find enough potential employees qualified to lift luggage, Eastern Airlines no longer delivers luggage at all. Passengers are encouraged to either carry on their luggage or ship via United Parcel Service.

The strike has taken its toll on the IALL as well. Though it started with a strike fund of over \$300 million, the coffers have since dwindled to less than \$250 million. Said IALL President Bubba L. Arnold, "We just take everyday like a step in some direction unlike the ones we have

previously stepped in."

IALL members have had a hard time living on their union welfare checks over the last year (Most members receive less than 10% of their former wage from this program).

Sarah Longhow worked for Eastern for less than two months before the strike, but now must live on only \$47,000 per year in union support checks. Said Sarah, "It's shore has been a hard year. I had to sell d' beach houth and the Beanie."

Some members realized that the strike might never end last year and have used their time productively. Don Albeam of Portland, Oregon, a 30 year Eastern luggage loader, expects to

graduate from Portland Middle School this summer. "School sure has changed since I was here. Girls got rights. Drugs is real easy to get," said Albeam.

Some members continue to fight, however. At the IALL bunker in Miami, gunfire continues throughout most of the night with Eastern's non-union forces gaining ground on the depleted IALL forces steadily.

A major victory was achieved last week when Eastern forces seized a catering building on the south side of the airport. Captain Albert Lamota, leader of Eastern forces on the south side of Miami International was quoted as saying, "If they've been eating in-flight meals for the last year, its only a matter of time."

IALL President Arnold is optimistic about the Miami conflict. "We just got them a shipment of pipe bombs last week, they're not going anywhere."

With thirteen months of fighting invested already neither side seems ready to give the battle. That's about it.

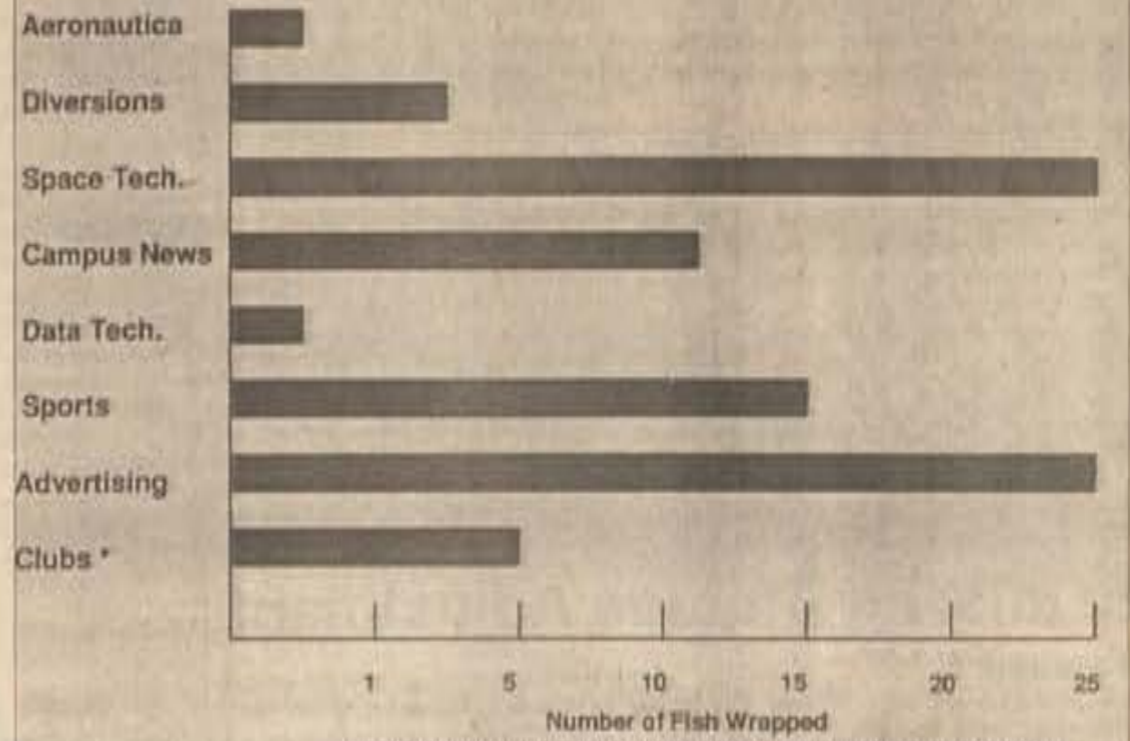
Despite the glass, no student were cut in the incident and repairs are expected to be completed within a week.

# Drop/Add renamed Add/Drop

"With the winds of change come a foul smell," Byron was never more right. Yesterday, Dean Rockett announced that the period that lasts the first couple of weeks of each semester will henceforth be known as "Add/Drop" instead of "Drop/Add."

In a carefully worded statement, Mr. Rockett said, "I feel that emphasizing the positive is what we want to do here at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. I, myself, received several complaints from alumni about the old name bringing along too much emotional baggage."

Embry-Riddle students spoken to by this reporter were mostly shocked by the announcement. Christy Alexandria, an AMT student, said she would consider leaving a University which "showed such little regard for its students. She went on further to argue that to "change the name at this point is absurd. Many people will obviously become confused, even disoriented by this decision."

While criticism mounts, the University stands firm behind its decision. "It was the only logical thing to do," said an assistant to President Tallman.

This reporter has learned one possible motivation behind the change. In a copy of a memo obtained by this newspaper and signed by Vice Presi-

dent Ledowitz, the Office of Planning and Control was advised to "change names of programs, holidays, and buildings with wreckless regard." Whether the Office of Planning and Control overstepped their authority with this latest decision is unclear.

Other students took the changes in stride. One Air Science student said, "Calling the Dorms L and H is easier because those two letters are right in the center of the alphabet." Other changes are expected and most are just becoming known. For instance, the new Airway Science building will be renamed the International Convulsion Laboratory next month.

When asked if the before-mentioned memo condoning confusion would cause the letters designating the academic buildings to change, a high ranking official said, "at least not until students figure out the current letters." He did say that all

rooms in all buildings will either be numbered 515 or 892.

Sources close to the University say that a possible coup may be in the offing among ERAU's top staff, with teachers and custodial workers leading a rebellion against all staff. Custodial staff have been seen amassing arms on the North side of the campus in a secret underground bunker.

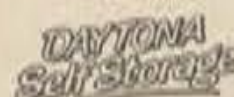

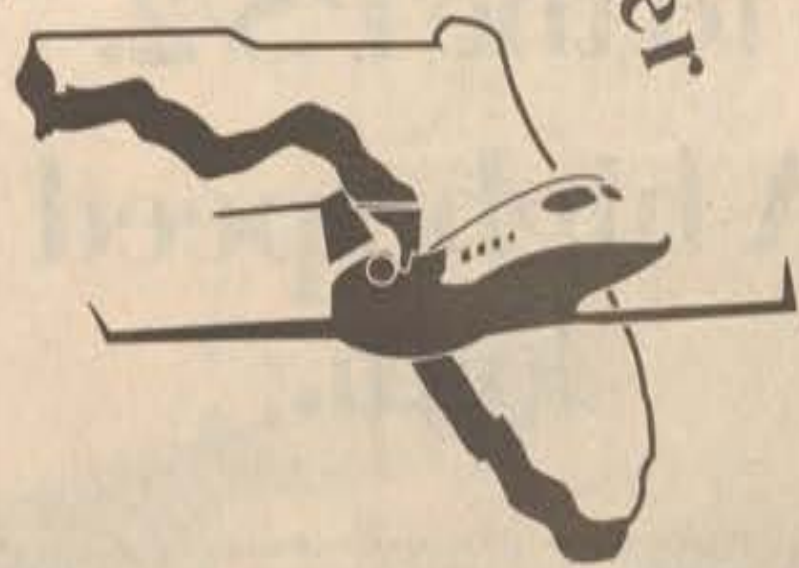

That's about it.

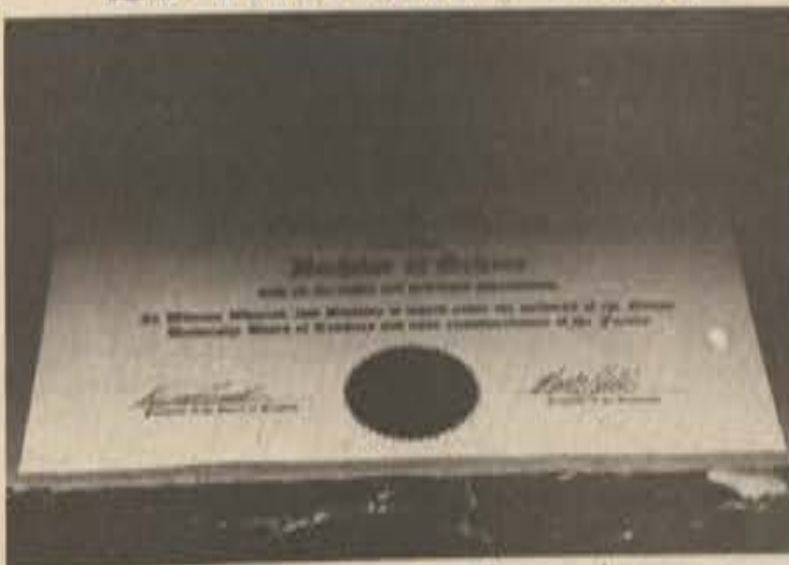

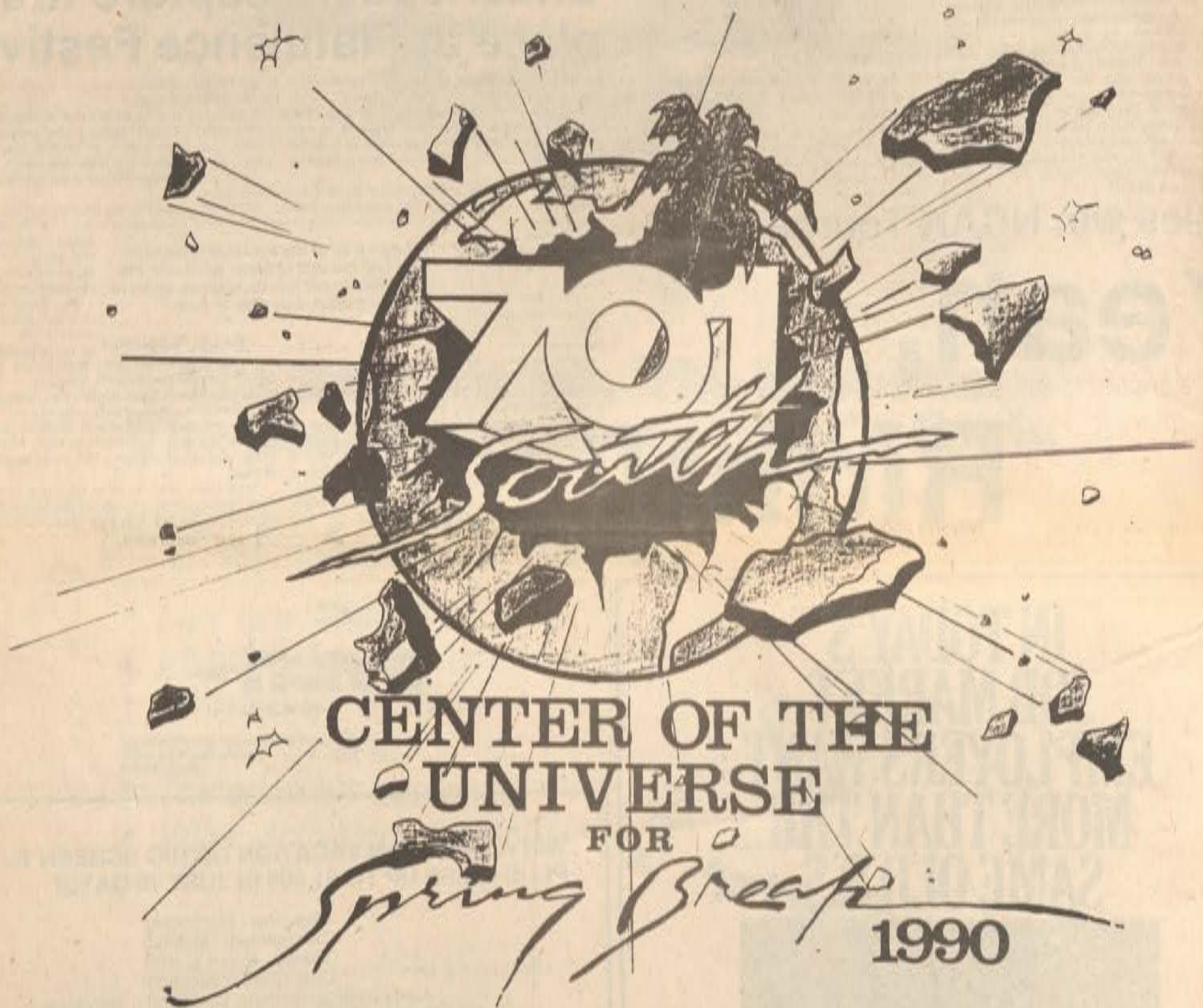
