



## Magellan spacecraft arrives at Venus

The Magellan spacecraft, on a mission to map the surface of Venus with imaging radar, successfully slipped into an elliptical orbit around the planet on Friday, August 10, 1990.

May 4, 1989. This is the first interplanetary probe sent by NASA since 1978. Magellan has been

The spacecraft fired its solid fuel rocket motor for 83 seconds to slow the spacecraft from a cruising speed of 24,600 mph to an orbital speed of 18,675 mph.

The spacecraft will gather "atrips" of data as it moves between Venus' north and south poles. The

data will be beamed back to Earth and will be received by the Deep Space Network tracking stations located in Spain, Australlia and California where computers will transform the information

Venus rotation, spacecraft will map as much as 90 percent of the Venusian surface. The probe is expected to last well into the 1990s.

NASA will try to use the information that it obtains from the Magellan spacecraft to create a video which will simulate a three-dimensional image of what it would be like to fly over the surface of

There are several similarities between the Earth and Venus. Scientists are interested in the fact that the two planets have approximately the same diameter, mass and density.

After the initial test period, Magellan was supposed to start mapping the surface September 1, but due to problems in communication, it has been postponed. Magellan lost touch with Earth for 14 hours starting August 16 and for 17.5 hours beginlingineers will continue trying to identify the

cause of the two communication failures. However, tentative plans call for the radar to be turned on again September 14 for a new series of radar tests to start the next day. There have been two previous attempts to map

Venus with space probes. A Soviet mission mapped about one quarter of the planet in 1982. The second probe was the U.S. Pioneer spacecraft in 1978,

The Magellan spacecraft will provide scientists with valuable information that will help them unlock the secrets of the solar system.

Titan rocket explodes in California... Shortly after 11 a.m. last Priday a Titan Advanced Solid Rocket motor ignited after being dropped in a test area at Edwards Air Force Base in California. A hazardous plume containing hydrocloric acid rose to a high altitude and dispersed away from any populated areas, nine people were confirmed injured and one person is missing presumed buried under the rubble. The exact cause of the accident is not yet known but seems to be a result of an accidental release by a lifting crane. The Astronautics Laboratory is the Air Force Systems Command unit responsible for developing and testing new rocket technologies.

Listen to the astronauts... The National Space Society offers a Dial-A-Shuttle service line which allows the public to listen in on the live communications between the shuttle and mission control. This service is available from liftoff to landing. Callers can dial 1-900-909-NASA 24 hours a day throughout the mission and listen in as the astronauts conduct thier duties in space. Dial-A-Shuttle is a service offered by the National Space Society, a nonprofit, publicly supported membership organization dedicated to the creation of a spacefaring civilization. The toll charge for the calls are \$2.00 for the first minute and 45 cents for each minute thereafter.

seems to slow across the country, Florida is bucking this trend with at least four airlines quickly building operations in the sunshine state.

Once the sole domain of now weary Eastern Airlines, Florida is being divided up like a pie. Once upon a time, commuters traversed the state in small Cessnas and Beechcraft, but now jets are plying those same routes. Princetown Boston Airlines' (PBA) Cessna 402s, for instance, have been replaced with F-28s on such routes as Tampa-Tallahassee and Ft. Lauderdale-Orlando.

Daytona Beach has not been quite so lucky, with the city's sole air service west or south a quartet of Embraers to Orlando. This is in spite of a somewhat dubious statement by by Orlando's Mayor which predicted that 1-4 from Tampa to Orlando to Daytona Beach will by the end of the decade be as populace as the Washington-New York-Boston strip in the northeast.

This is changing, however, September 1, Pan Am Express begins Jetstream 31 service to Miami and Melbourne from Daytona Beach, Putting that aside, Orlando's airport authority is quickly building a new concourse for the flood of new flights being added by Walt Disney's new official airline, Delta. Their schedule there already includes nonstop trans-continental departures, as well as increased frequencies to most northeast cities.

Delta's commuter, Comair, also provides numerous flights to cities throughout Florida and the Carribbean using Embraer's 30 passenger EMB-120 Brasilia and 18 operates as the Delta Connection at Delta's Cincinnati PBA in that its sys- with the completion of it's new flight center in Orlando.

For those who enjoy their travel with a little more celerity, USAir also seems to building both its Orlando and Tampa operations into formidable hubs. At Orlando, USAir operates its intra-state hub. There, former Piedmont F-28s and 737s meet with smaller Boeing Dash-8s and fan out from Pensacola to Key West, USAir continues to add flights at both its sunny hubs and offers service to Miami in an attempt to both stay ahead of Pan Am and Los Angeles from both cities. Tampa recently received a claim as many of Eastern's former passengers as possible.

Pan American, in what could be its last stand. is attempting to build up Miami in hope of steaming the losses that have plagued the airline for so long. Pan Am has been a player in the Miami market since its birth, but its presence took on new significance when Pan Am completed a wrenching merger with National Airlines ten years ago. Pan Am's operations there became increasingly more meager there, until Eastern's bankruptcy last year

Since then, new flights have been added to the usual northeastern cities, Carribean destinations, and Pan Am's

Working with the Navy, the plant has identified alternative cleaning methods, such as

hand-wiping rather than chemical sprays, These new procedures protect the ozone, yet do not sacrifice product integrety.

Other facilities, including the headquarters plant in Evandale, Ohio, are working to eliminate methyl chloroform as a degreaser.

The best feature of this computer is the removable data card slot. This slot allows the user to insert the various data cards available for the many different applications this computer performs. The card slot uses the transparent keypad to relay data to the Wizard. This is truly the best feature of the Wizard, but it is also the most expensive since the data
