LITERATURE REVIEW



HAVE YOU DONE THE FOLLOWING?

OUTLINE

Clearly outlined the purpose of your review? What about the context? Scope (limitations)? Audience?



SOURCES

Found and evaluated technical, credible, peer-reviewed sources to synthesize and focus into your research?

CITATION

Integrated these sources with bibliographic detail that adheres to a citation style?



SOURCES

Analyzed/Critiqued sources as they pertain to the discussion at hand?

LITERATURE

Identified gaps in the literature and research? Strengths? Weaknesses? Themes?



CONNECTIONS

Made connections between your sources?

INFORMATION

Have you looked at pertinent info, such as methodologies/theories/ models?



VIEWPOINTS

Discussed the varying viewpoints, controversial findings, etc?

WRITING

Written an introduction, body, and conclusion?



PROOF-READ

Checked the spelling and grammar?
