for they are seen only by men who take to the air.

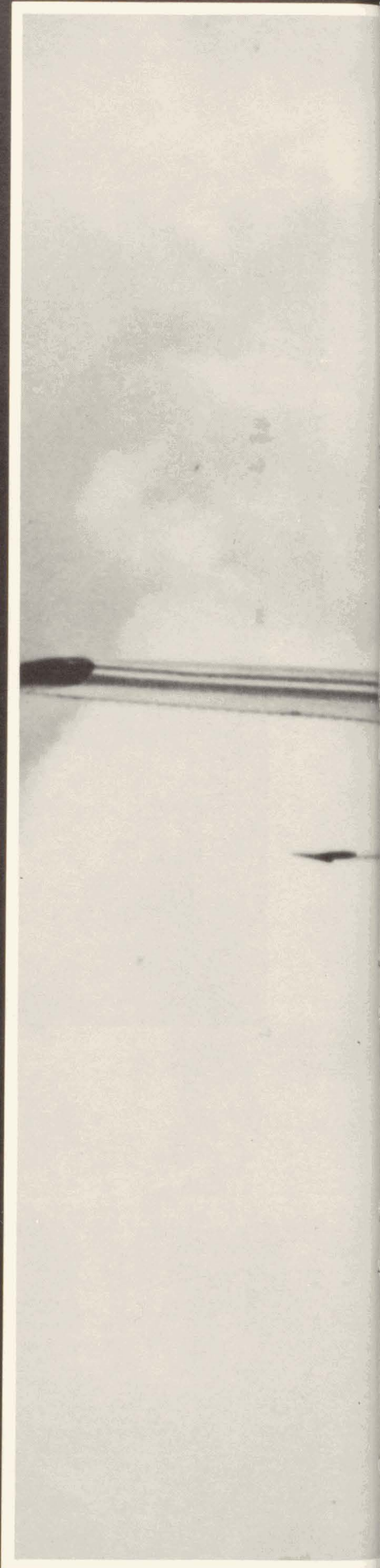
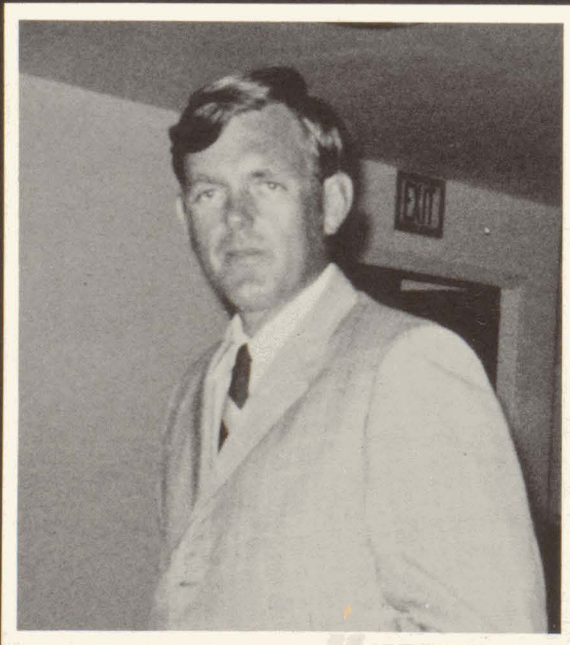
The patchwork of our midwestern plains

for they are seen only by men to take to the air.

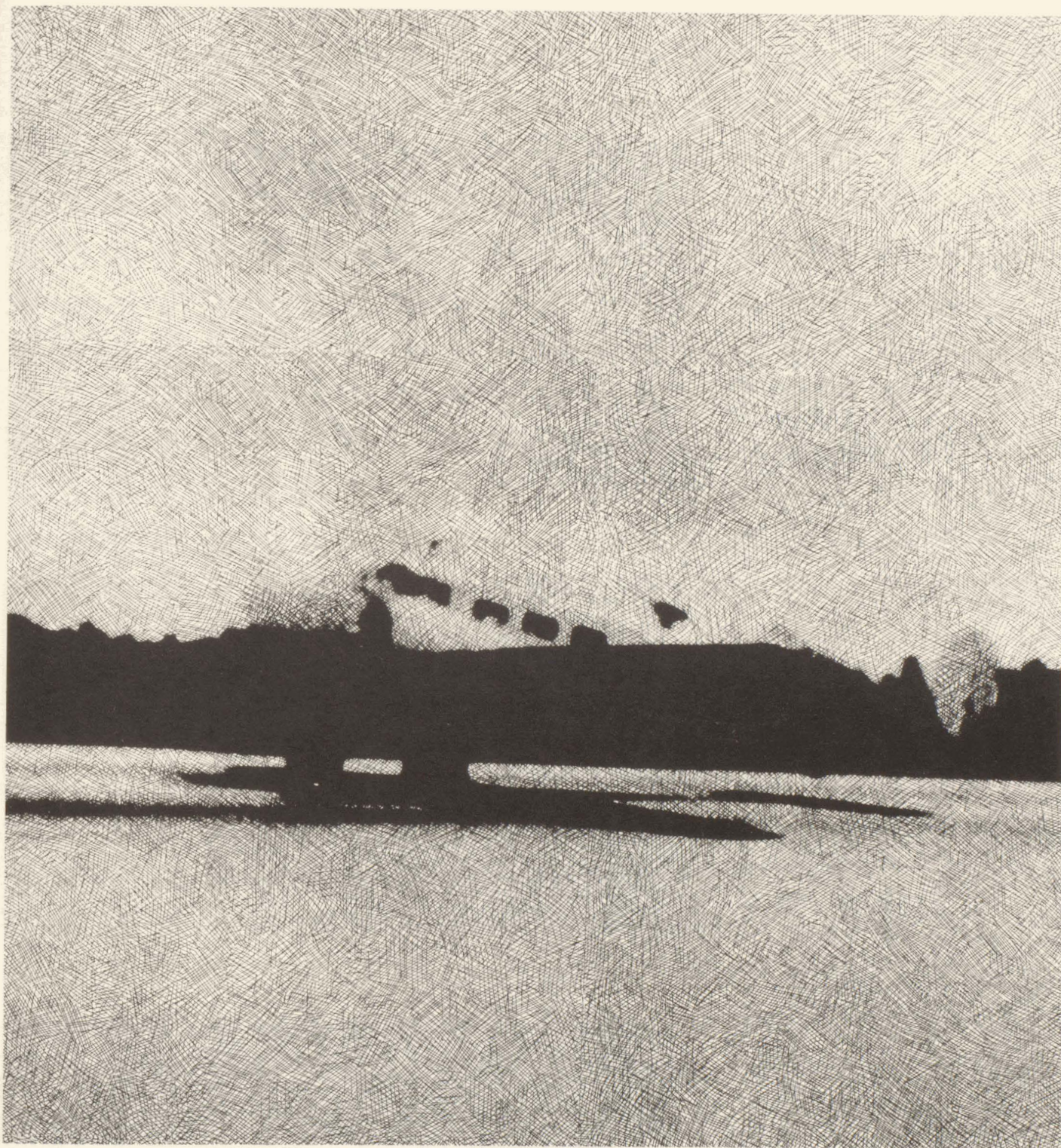

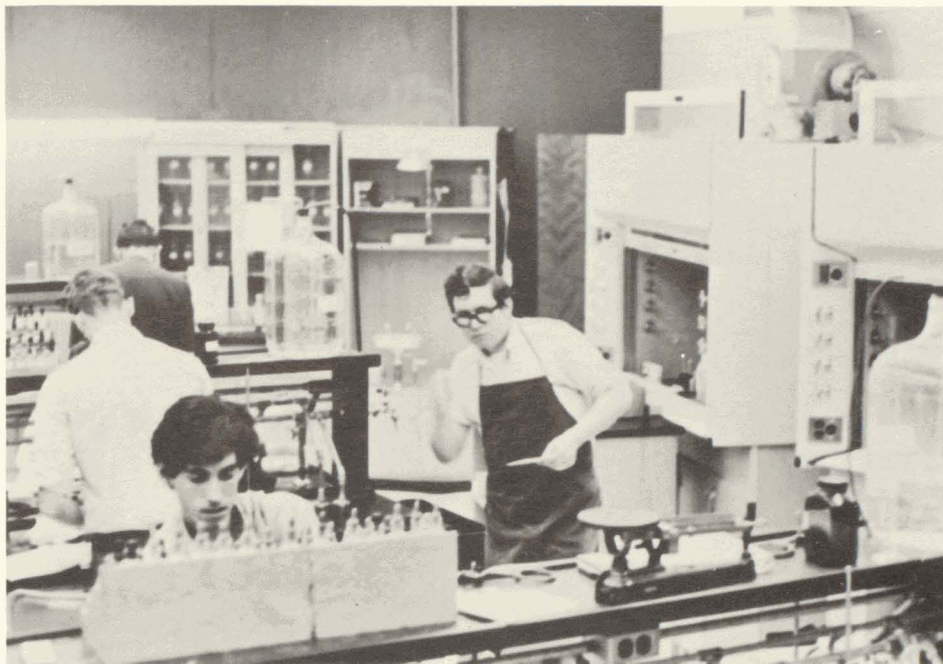
PERIODIC CHART OF THE ATOMS

A lot of experts are busy trying to prove that a man named Gustave Whitehead put a plane in the air two years before the Wright Brothers.

In 1899 Gustave Alvin Whitehead, now honored annually in Bridgeport, Connecticut on August 14th as Connecticut's Father of Aviation, was forced to leave Pittsburgh a step ahead of the law. In Germany, Whitehead is honored, too, in his native Bavarian town of Leutershausen; likewise at Ansbach where the Aero Club dedicated its new hangar to him in 1966, and in Nurnberg, where in a new subdivision a street carries the name, WEISSKOPFSTRASSE (Whitehead Street). The Museum at Munich lists Whitehead among aviation pioneers. The Connecticut Aeronautical Historical Association (CAHA) is promoting an unbiased intensive study of Whitehead and his work, and it plans to devote a section of its museum entirely to him.

What was Whitehead's crime in Pittsburgh? He built a steampowered airplane and flew it into the wall of a newly constructed three-story building, according to the statement of his helper who also occupied the machine. The helper was burned severely by escaping steam and was hospitalized. He bore the scars to his death years later. Others living in Pittsburgh testified in the 1930's to having some knowledge of this incident. However, the news item and picture reported as appearing in the PITTSBURGH PRESS has not been found.

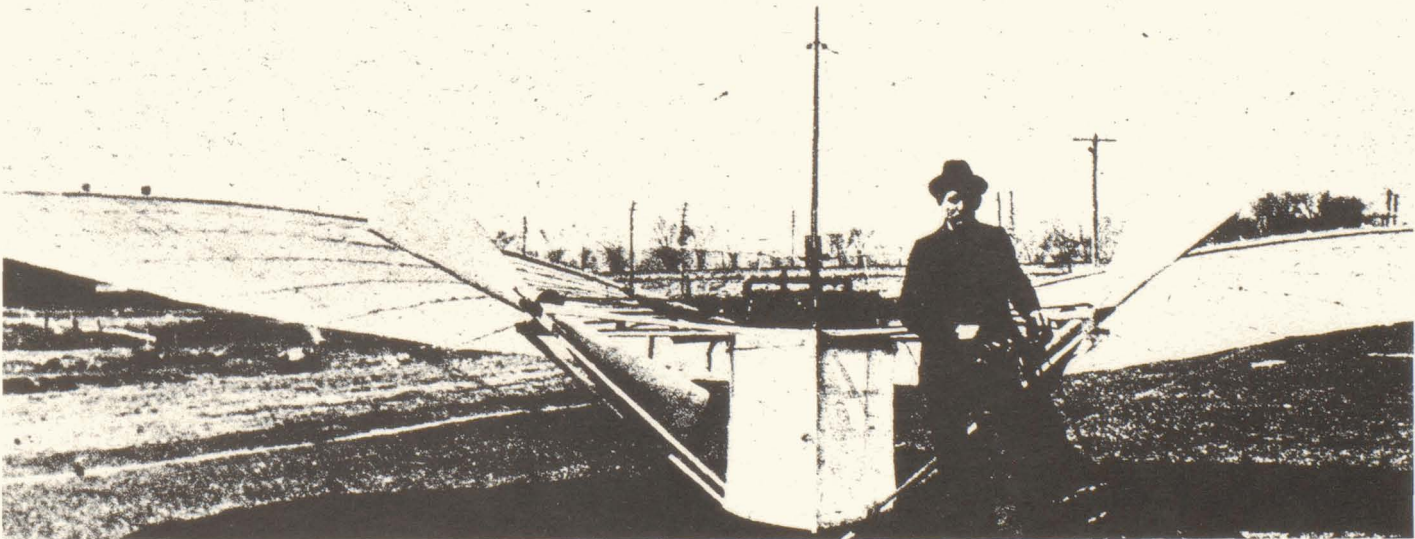
Whitehead and his assistant went to Bridgeport, Connecticut, where Whitehead continued his work. A number of people have testified to seeing his airplanes fly. On August 14, 1901 the Sunday Editor of the BRIDGEPORT HERALD witnessed a definite flight, and reported it fully in his August 18th, 1901 edition. Whitehead himself published a report of two flights made in January 1902, over Long Island Sound. The second of these was a circular flight of about seven miles length.

Aviation authorities have known of these reported flights, but not until 1963 was any kind of official investigation undertaken — too late to interview many of those who had witnessed them. The 9315th U.S. Air Force Reserve Squadron first undertook an investigation, and was soon joined by CAHA. They presented the results of the research of the 1930's and their own three year's work (to 1966) before the staff of Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum (NASM) in Jan-

uary 1966. NASM was impressed, and urged them to continue their research. This has been done. Their six years' work has brought to light much more evidence of Whitehead's aviation work, the most significant feature of which appears to have been the variety and excellence, for that period, of the engines he constructed. Today, both in Germany and this country, qualified aviation engineers are constructing models of some of Whitehead's airplanes; wind tunnel tests and others will be made, and the findings submitted to the Review Committee. Models built in Germany have been flying by radio control.

The present CAHA study may require several years to complete, at the end of which a national (perhaps international) panel of experts will review committee findings and make a conclusive statement concerning Whitehead's status and position among early aviation pioneers.

As I extend to you my personal congratulations and best wishes, I look to the future with greater confidence because I know of the exceptional qualifications you bring to the exceptional demands of our time.

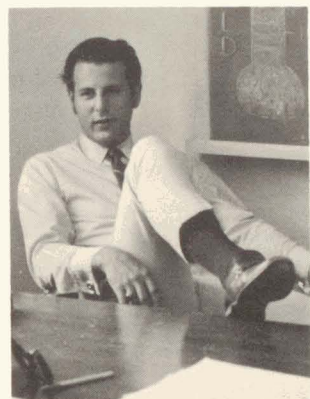
