## INTENT

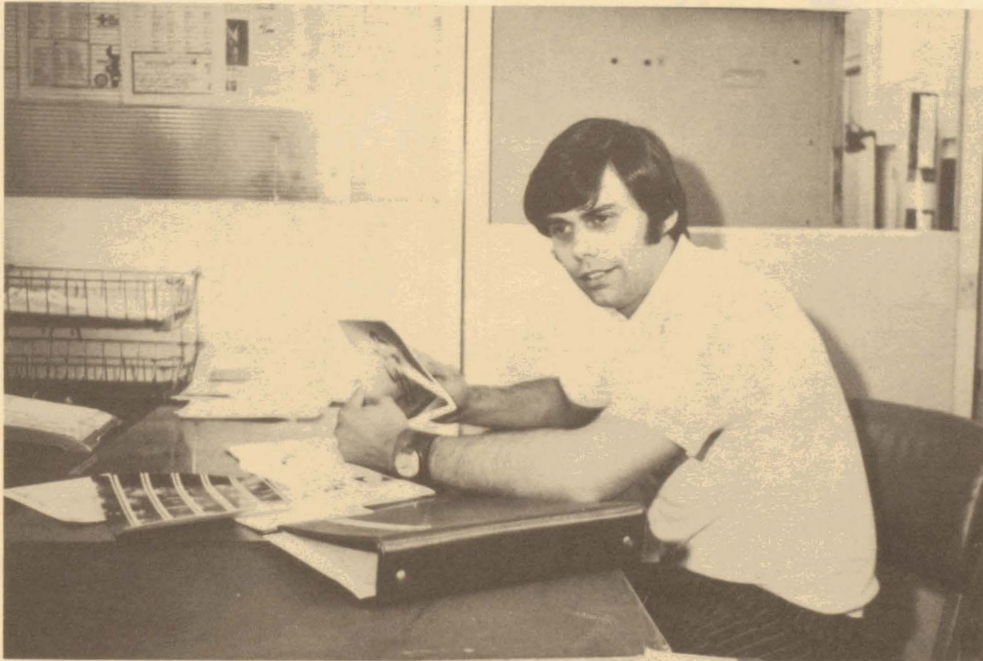




# A CLOSING
