# **Overview of the Minor**

The Latin American Studies minor introduces students to the language, history, and cultures of Latin American countries, and comparisons between Latin American countries as well as the diaspora in the United States.

Students can earn the minor by successfully completing at least 15 related credit hours (5 classes). Students enrolling in the minor must choose one of two options:

1) Language and Culture

or

2) History and Culture

# Why pursue the minor?

- To be competitive for jobs that require knowledge of Latin American cultures and/or Spanish.
- To be able to demonstrate to future employers evidence of a sophisticated understanding of the diverse cultures in Latin America and high intercultural communication skills.
- To prepare for today's global, multicultural, and multilingual workplace.
- To learn about the language, history, and cultures of Latin American countries and the diaspora.
- To get credit on your transcript for earning the minor and taking cool classes!

In addition to offering Spanish classes, we offer classes focused on diverse topics such as Maya mythology, inter-American relations, Latin American science fiction, and more!

## **Language and Culture Option**

The Language and Culture option is for students who want to focus on learning Spanish (though you will also learn about the history and cultures of Latin American and the Latino/a diaspora). All the Spanish language classes are taught in Spanish, but the history and culture classes are all taught in English. This option includes the required courses for students learning Spanish. This option was designed for students who want to learn or improve their Spanish skills.

## **History and Culture Option**

The History and Culture option is for students who wish to focus on Latin American history and culture because they either don't want to learn Spanish or they are already fluent. All the classes in this option will serve as General Education electives, so you can get credit for the minor and your Gen Ed credits at the same time! This option was designed for students who want to learn about Latin American history and culture, but don't need or want to take Spanish (either because they are already fluent or because they just prefer not to take language classes).
